## **About Tracey & Sarah**

**Tracey Morgan** of Bealesville, MD has been riding since the age of 14. Her driving career took off more than 15 years ago. Over the past 5 years she has placed in the top three in every major national competition she has entered.

Tracey has won the USEF National Pony Pair Championship eight times. She is also a four-time member of the US Team sent to the World Pony Championships. She was part of the bronze medal-winning team in 2007 and placed individually 8<sup>th</sup> in 2005 and 5<sup>th</sup> in 2009.



In 2009 Tracey's Dartmoor ponies also received the distinction of being the USEF Combined Driving Pony Pair Champions. Tracey is also a ridden dressage competitor and has received Silver and Bronze Medals from the USDF.

Tracey says she's involved in driving because she loves horses and being outdoors. She is excited to be part of this three-day workshop saying, "When I have had the



opportunity to spend several days with a top driver, I have found that I learn skills that are incorporated into my training program on a permanent basis, instead of just a quick fix." She also tells me that she is happy to work with drivers of all skill levels, singles or multiples, from mini's to warmbloods.



**Sarah Dalton-Morris** has been teaching, training and managing equestrian activities for the past 30 years. Her experience with eventing lends itself well to the competitive carriage driver.

She has a strong background in classical dressage and offers a no-nonsense approach that any level or type of driver can appreciate.

Sarah's training philosophy centers around the horse's well-being and developing a positive attitude between the horse and driver. She offers a variety of workshops throughout the year for riders and drivers and has developed a program that allows the participants to work at their level and gain the skills necessary to improve the relationship with their equine partners.
