What's the best job for me at a Driving event?

- **Timer:** Want a close-up view of the action and comfortable with a stopwatch? Be a timer for cones, or marathon events!
- **Hospitality:** A great way to meet people and explore the grounds while providing refreshments to volunteers and officials.
- **Scribe:** A fantastic learning opportunity! Must be able to write legibly and quickly to record judge's comments.
- **Vet Check Station** (Horse Driving Trial only): Want to be up close and personal with the competing horses? Record results of vet check to help ensure the safety of all.
- **Course Spotter:** Observe the Marathon phase of an event (but don't give directions!) Be ready to call for help, alert competitor if there is another entry nearby, or describe what you saw if a competitor is off course.
- **Scoring:** Good with numbers? Record and calculate scores and results.
- **Hazard Judges** (Combined Driving Event only): Records faults/ time for each competitor at a hazard. Uses a radio to communicate with show officials. A front row seat for the most exciting marathon phase. Like fence judging for the driving enthusiast.
- **Gate Stewards:** Are you people person? Here's a way to interact with competitors and keep the show running on time. (And see all those gorgeous horses!)
- Cones Crew: Keep the competition fair keeping the distance the same on the cones course for different carriage wheel widths. Fun and easy exercise. Get wheel measurements, set cones and make minor adjustments while watching the action!
- **Score Runners:** Bring your bike! A good way to see all aspects of the event as you bring in score sheets.
- Awards: Coordinate trophies and ribbons and congratulate competitors.
- Crossing Guard: Ensure Entries get safely across the road, and keep things moving!
